# Disasters Happen So San Jose Rotary Supports ShelterBox

During 2008 San Jose Rotary funded two ShelterBoxes that were both sent to Pakistan after their most recent earthquake (ShelterBox makes the decision on where your box is deployed). ShelterBox deployed 10,482 boxes in 2008 to victims of 18 different disasters - see below.



## 2008 Year in Review: ShelterBox Deployments

2008 has been a year of milestones for ShelterBox. In November we responded to our 75th disaster and delivered aid to our 50th country. American sponsors funded the 5,000th US ShelterBox. This year, 10,482 boxes have been deployed, helping over 100,000 people affected by these crises:

Afghanistan Refugees (IDPs) - 300 Boxes
Bolivia Floods - 200 Boxes
China Earthquake - 2,050 Boxes
Congo Refugees (IDPs) - 400 Boxes
Ecuador Floods - 200 Boxes
Haiti Hurricane - 451 Boxes
Honduras Floods - 100 Boxes
Kenya Refugees (IDPs) - 824 Boxes
Mozambique Floods - 170 Boxes
Myanmar (Burma) Cyclone - 2,298 Boxes

Nepal Floods - 624 Boxes

Pakistan Earthquake - 800 Boxes

Somaliland Refugees (IDPs) - 190 Boxes

Sudan Refugees (IDPs) - 703 Boxes

Swaziland AIDS Orphans - 584 Boxes

Turks & Caicos Hurricane - 168 Boxes

Ukraine Floods - 220 Boxes

Zambia Floods - 200 Boxes






