Bill Sherry ~ "San Jose Airport"

Bill Sherry is the director of the Norman Y. Mineta San Jose International Airport (SJC), a completely self-supporting enterprise, owned and operated by the City of San Jose. The airport averages nearly 384 commercial and 156 general aviation departures and landings daily, serving approximately 11 million passengers per year.

Since his May 2005 appointment as Director of Aviation in San Jose, **Bill** has addressed several critical issues. By November 2005, major revisions to the Airport Master Plan Development Program were approved by the San Jose City Council to bring the airport vision and budget (formerly \$2.8 billion) in-line with current economic factors. The new \$1.5 billion development program, to be completed by 2017, calls for the stepped-up delivery of numerous critical customer service amenities by the end of this decade. Bill also addressed to the satisfaction of the airlines the adjustment of more reasonable projections for passenger growth rates and airline fees, preparing the way for the upcoming airline contract negotiations. In addition, **Bill** is working with staff and consultants to develop a Business Plan for the Airport, exploring various opportunities for additional revenue generation and cost reductions.

Bill's aviation experience includes seven years as Airport Director at Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport (FLL) where he had oversight and responsibility for a \$4.2 billion airport expansion. Previously, Bill held posts as Director of Aviation for the State of Florida, and as Airport Director for the Vero Beach Municipal Airport, Florida's busiest general aviation airport. He is an experienced commercial pilot and flight instructor.

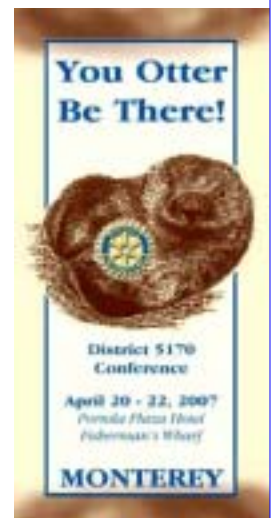
