Recycle Your Old Cell Phones at our Rotary Meetings

Though tiny, cell phones add up to a big pollution threat because they have the shortest average life span among consumer electronics (1.5 years). It is estimated that 100 million cell phones are discarded every year, 65,000 tons of hazardous trash. With over 200 million cell phones in use across the United States, plus another 500 million unwanted or outdated phones stocked piled in drawers, etc., that adds up to a lot of toxic waste, such as lead and mercury

found in every unit, it is important to people's health as well as the environment to keep cell phones out of landfills and incinerators.

Through your re-cycling of used cell phones through Rotary, which are given to San Jose's Happy Hollow Park, 100% of the funds raised by Happy Hollow are donated to non-profit Orangutan Conservancy who is helping to preserve one of the most critically endangered species on earth, the orangutan and it's habitat. PolioPlus Update

PolioPlus is Rotary's effort to eliminate polio around the world. All but four countries (Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan) have been declared Polio-Free. It is expected there will be just 400 new cases during 2005-2006. By comparison, there were 352,000 new cases of polio in just the United States during 1952. Rotary hopes there will be no new cases in 2006-2007 and that the world will be declared Polio-Free in 2008. Rotarians around the world have given more than \$600 million to this cause. San Jose Rotarians have given over \$300,000 and you should be proud of all that Rotary has accomplished during the last 18 years.
