Jed York **"San Francisco 49ers"**

As director of strategic planning for the San Francisco 49ers, **Jed York** serves as a business analyst for the team, and is responsible for the integration of brand strategies and projects related to the long-term operational and financial development of the organization. He is currently a key member of the project team working towards the construction of a new stadium for the team in the Bay Area by 2012.

York joined the organization in 2005, where he held the position of special projects manager. In that capacity, he aided the restructuring of the Coaching and Player Personnel departments. After the hiring of Head Coach Mike Nolan and Vice President of Player Personnel Scot McCloughan, **York** worked with each department to learn the ins and outs of the team. He relied on that experience to coordinate management from each department to ensure the organization was working on a single track towards achieving its goals both on the field and in the community.

Prior to his work with the 49ers, **York** began his career as a financial analyst at Guggenheim Partners, a diversified financial services firm. He worked in the New York office in several areas, including private wealth management, hedge funds risk analysis, and collateralized debt obligations.

York's roots with the 49ers run deep. He is the oldest child of John and Denise York, the current owners of the team. His uncle and godfather Eddie DeBartolo Jr., was former owner of the 49ers. A 49er fan since birth, **Jed** attended his first Niners game in 1984. His goal has always been to carry on his family's tradition of success and excellence.

Born and raised in Youngstown, Ohio, **York** was a student athlete at Cardinal Mooney High School. At Cardinal Mooney, he was Captain of the baseball team and Student Body President. After high school, he decided to carry on a family tradition by attending University of Notre Dame, where he earned a degree in both finance and history. His studious nature earned him membership into Phi Alpha Theta, the National History Honors Society. He also had the opportunity to study abroad in London in 2002.

York credits his parents, Uncle Eddie and his grandfather Edward DeBartolo Sr. a prolific real estate developer, as being positive role models. He credits them for instilling character values such as integrity, a strong work ethic, respect for others and a good business sense coupled with a strong commitment to community service. Besides his tremendous passion for the 49ers, **Jed** enjoys traveling, fishing, and playing cards, which he learned from his grandfather.
