Majorie Freedman "School Nutrition"

Marjorie Freedman is an Assistant Professor in the Nutrition and Food Science Department at San Jose State University. Freedman received her M.S. and Ph.D. in Nutrition from UC Davis. She has worked in the field of nutrition for over 20 years; in industry, for a non-profit educational company, as a nutrition consultant and in academia.

As Manager, Scientific Affairs, for The NutraSweet Company, she traveled throughout the US and abroad educating health care professionals about the safety and benefits of the high-intensity sweetener NutraSweet (aspartame).

As the Vice President of Education for INR, a non-profit scientific organization dedicated to research and education in the fields of science and medicine, she prepared curriculum on a wide variety of topics, including weight loss, obesity and diabetes, performance nutrition, cardiovascular health, alternative medicine, and women's health. She presented over 650 seminars to health care professionals throughout the United States and Canada on these and other topics.

As a nutrition consultant, she provided expertise to Shape Up America! The Kellogg Company, The McDonalds Corp., Murdoch books, and the US Department of Agriculture. She authored the paper "Popular Diets: A Scientific Review" and was on the faculty of the American Dietetic Association's Weight Management Certification Program.

Freedman also currently holds the position of Research Assistant at UC Davis where she is working with an international team to evaluate the literature on obesity (CORET: Collaborative Obesity Research Evaluation Team).

Finally, as a parent volunteer, Freedman spearheaded the effort to remove junk food from her daughter's middle school in San Jose. She is an active member of the San Jose Unified School District's SHAPE committee, the Santa Clara County Office of Education's Fit for Learning Task Force and the Santa Clara County Children's Health and Fitness Coalition.

PolioPlus Update

PolioPlus is Rotary's effort to eliminate polio around the world. All but four countries (Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan) have been declared Polio-Free. It is expected there will be just 400 new cases during 2005-2006. By comparison, there were 352,000 new cases of polio in just the United States during 1952. Rotary hopes there will be no new cases in 2006-2007 and that the world will be declared Polio-Free in 2008. Rotarians around the world have given more than \$600 million to this cause. San Jose Rotarians have given over \$300,000 and you should be proud of all that Rotary has accomplished during the last 18 years.
