"What the Heck Happened to Pluto: Planets, Dwarf Planets and the New Solar System"

Renowned and multi-honored scientist, Andrew Fraknoi, Chair of the Astronomy Program at Foothill College, is back to enlighten us with news of the cosmos. Last year astronomers shocked the world by declaring that Pluto, the "ninth planet" isn't; it is a "dwarf planet."

Dr. Fraknoi will fill us in on what happened in public and behind the scenes. We'll hear about the weird 10th planet, bigger than Pluto, and about a

swarm of strange objects now being found at the edge of our solar system. He will show us how our picture of what the solar system includes is changing quickly and dramatically through the use of new instruments on Earth and in space.

The list of **Dr. Fraknoi's** achievements in education, publications (including a forthcoming one for children to be published by the Disney company) and professional associations show not only his creativity but his unusually diligent work habits. He is the recipient of many professional awards, but he has also gained a sort of immortality.

In honor of his work in sharing the excitement of modern astronomy with students, teachers and the public, the International Astronomical Union has named a particular orbiting body Asteroid Fraknoi.

Someone must ask him, "What planet are you going around with?" But you'll have a lot more questions as he tells us 'What's up with Out There?'

John Baird joined Rotary in 2000, and was sponsored was Richard Conniff. He is currently a member of the Board of Directors and has served as Chair of the Youth Exchange and ELC Committees. As Chair of ELC, he was instrumental in doubling the size of the committee, and streamlining the marketing and recruiting process which resulted in an increase in applications. His work on the ELC curriculum has resulted in a more relevant and "student friendly" curriculum. Through his industry contacts, he has been able to book notable keynote speakers from such companies as Apple and Electronic Arts.

John co-chaired (with Gary Shara) Rotary's efforts to rebuild the Rainbow Childcare Center in Slidell LA after Hurricane Katrina. This effort involved collaboration with 24 clubs from districts 5150 and 5170. Through these efforts \$225,000 was raised to help with 6 projects in Slidell. John also produced a DVD to document Rotary's story on rebuilding the Rainbow Center.

Campbell Rotary Donates to the San Salvador Rotoplast Mission

Campbell Rotary has joined San Jose Rotary in funding the needs of the Rotaplast doctors for the trip to Salvador on June 4th. Campbell Rotary has donated \$650 for the purchase of medical instruments to be used during the trip and the equipment will be donated to local doctors at the end of the trip.
