

Ward Connerly "Racism: Alive And Well In U.S. Today"

Ward Connerly, former U of C Regent, political activist, and businessman is the person, in the eyes of many, who is considered the man behind California's controversial Proposition 209, outlawing race and gender based considerations in state university admissions and hiring. His influence has also been felt in Washington State and Michigan, both having adopted similar laws. Mr. **Connerly** is Founder and CEO of Connerly Associates, Chairman of the American Civil Rights Institute, a member of the Sacramento Rotary Club, and sees himself as a Republican.



Today, Mr. **Connerly** is focusing much of his effort and time on the task of educating the national public about the need to "move beyond race and specifically, racial and gender preferences." He is recognized as an outspoken advocate of equal opportunity for ALL Americans "regardless of race, sex, or ethnic background."

Mr. Connerly was born in Leesville, Louisiana in 1939 and after his mother died, was raised by his relatives and grandparents, who were all of modest means. He attended Sacramento State College, eventually receiving a BA with honors in Political Science in 1962. Both at college and after graduating, Connerly was active in student politics and then in the California legislature. It was during his work there that he became friends with then-legislator Pete Wilson, later to become Governor in 1991. At Wilson's suggestion, Connerly got out of government and founded his consulting and land-use planning company, where his wife is an equal partner! In 1993, he was appointed by Gov. Wilson to a 12 year term on the UC Board of Regents.

Rotarian Of The Week ~ Sandy Ellenberg

The purpose of the Rotarian of the Week is to put a face on what it means to be a true Rotarian and to inspire all of us to strive to be better Rotarians and to ask that person to share why they are so involved in our Rotary Club.

This weeks "Rotarian of the Week" recipient was Sandy Ellenberg

Sandy Ellenberg joined Rotary in 1984. His sponsor was Harvey Knoerschild, another physician and classmate of his at Cal. He was a member of he Membership and Program Committee in addition to Rotoplast. He made his mark as a Rotarian through his work with Rotoplast. In 2000 Sandy first traveled to Venezuela as a lead surgeon on a National Rotoplast mission. He earned the nickname the "Animal" during that trip as he performed over 85 cleft lip and cleft palate surgeries on impoverished children - changing their lives for the better and forever. In 2002, he organized, fundraised and led a San Jose Rotary trip to Venezuela where he



again performed multiple surgeries. In 2004 Sandy inspired and organized a Rotoplast trip to India. He could not travel because of his illness, but many members of this club participated on the trip. He was an ambassador of Rotoplast, speaking and sharing his slides to over 25 different Rotary clubs throughout the area. He frequently visited other clubs wherever he traveled including clubs in Venice, Italy and Haifa, Isreal. He also traveled to international rotary conferences.
