

Contributions Committee Grants Report and Recommendations for Funding 2006-07 Cycle 2 (Approved June 28, 2007)

The Contributions Committee received more than twice as much in requests (\$117,686) than we are able to fund this cycle. The committee did a tremendous job of doing their site visits, narrowing down the proposals and scaling back some of the projects.

We are recommending 16 Grants for a total of \$58,027

- \$20,939 for 5 Rotary/City of San Jose Partnership Fund Grants.
- \$37,088 for 11 Community Grants
