# Carlos Aguilar & Isaac Hurtado "Music Music Music"



On Wednesday, June 20th, Rotarians will have the pleasure of hearing two of Opera San José's Principal Artists-in-Residence, bass **Carlos Aguilar** and tenor **Isaac Hurtado**.



Aguilar, a California native, came to San Jose State University on a football scholarship. He became interested in music and singing with the <u>SJSU Choraliers</u>, where his natural talent and exceptional gifts brought him to the attention of Irene Dalis. Selected as an Opera San José Principal Artist-in-Residence in 2006, he has performed leading roles in several Opera San José productions. He also has received several vocal performance awards, including recognition from the San Jose Opera Guild and the Woman's Club of San Jose.



<u>Hurtado</u> is a Utah native. He received his musical training at Florida State University, the Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music, and Brigham Young University. In addition to his appearances in leading roles with Opera San José, he has performed with Utah Festival Opera, Central City Opera in Colorado, Cincinnati Opera, Opera *Lucca* in Italy, and others. He has received numerous awards for vocal performance, and became an Opera San José Principal Artist-in-Residence last year.

These two fine artists will describe their experiences and challenges as young professional opera singers. Most important, as you hear them sing you will discover why they were chosen for their roles and responsibilities at Opera San José.

We have had an incredible busy trip. We will be meeting with 4 Rotary Clubs tomorrow night that sponsored a trip here. We have had such a great experience compared to last year, the Military Hospital has been terrific. They have been very accommodating. We screened 164 patients, we will perform over 100 surgeries. Some of the surgeries are very extensive. We have been working from 7 in the morning until 8 at night to get it all done. It is a great experience but we are tired. Today we experienced a long earthquake, we just watched the building shake, our surgery suites are on the second floor. 


#### **Advocates For President-Elect Julie Matsushima's Goal**
