





Robert Klein "Stem Cell Research Project"

Robert N. Klein is President of Klein Financial Corporation, a real estate investment banking consulting company focused on affordable housing finance and development with a record of raising approximately \$3 billion in financing and/or developing public and private projects and organizations.

Bob's commitment to advancing medical research originated in his youngest son Jordan's diagnosis with Juvenile Diabetes in 2001. In



addition, his mother was diagnosed with Alzheimer's two years earlier; his father having died from heart disease over a decade earlier. **Bob** served as Chairman of the California Proposition 71 committee, the champion sponsor of the "Californian Stem Cell Research and Cures" ballot initiative, passed in November of 2004 by 59% of the California voters, that supports research with a focus on pluripotent and progenitor stem cell research and other related "Vital Research Opportunities". Prop 71 bans funding for human reproductive cloning.

Time Magazine honored **Bob** as one of their "100 Most Influential People of the Year" for 2005. Soon after, *Scientific American* named Bob one of "The Scientific American 50" as a leader shaping the future of science.

Bob has a Bachelor of Arts in History with Honors from Stanford University and a Juris Doctorate from Stanford Law School. Bob will dissect the California Stem Cell Research Project for Rotary on Wednesday.
