Carl Honaker "Aviation in Santa Clara County"

Carl Honaker, Director of Airports for Santa Clara County and a member of our Rotary Club, will provide us with an overview of aviation in Silicon Valley, with an emphasis on the three General Aviation (GA) airports that he manages. The GA airports in the Bay Area provide a valuable reliever function for the three primary commercial service airports, SFO, OAK and



SJC, offloading many flights that would compete for airspace with the passenger and cargo flights into and out of these airports. General Aviation is commonly mistaken as only small privately owned single engine aircraft, but actually encompasses all aviation activity not associated with commercial and military aircraft, and includes everything from blimps to business jets. **Carl** will educate us on the current status of our airports and what the future holds for air traffic in the Bay Area.

Carl has been with the County for nearly six years now. His love for aviation led him to a 20 year career in the U.S. Navy, flying training and transport aircraft and P-3 Orion long range patrol aircraft worldwide during the cold war. He eventually ended up at Naval Air Station Moffett Field as the last Executive Officer before the base was transferred to NASA in 1994 and then he retired from active duty. Carl worked for NASA to help them manage the facility for five years before taking over as Facilities Director at The Tech Museum in 2000. He continued his involvement in aviation as an airport commissioner for Mineta San Jose International Airport before receiving the offer to get back into airport management with the County. As announced last week, he was selected as the SWAAAE "Airport Executive of the Year" for 2007. He and his wife, Karen, have been active San Jose residents for over 20 years.
