Steve Dietz is Director of the ISEA2006 Symposium and ZeroOne San Jose: An International Festival of Art on the Edge, a new biennial festival of global art taking place in San Jose August 7-13, 2006. He is former Curator of New Media at the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis where he founded the New Media Initiatives department in 1996, the online art Gallery 9 and digital art study collection.

Dietz is an internationally renowned new media curator who speaks and writes extensively about new media. His interviews and writings have appeared in many industry and academic publications.

He has taught digital art at California College of the Arts, Carleton College, the University of Minnesota, and the Minneapolis College of Art and Design. Prior to the Walker Art Center, Dietz was founding Chief of Publications and New Media Initiatives at the Smithsonian American Art Museum and editor of the scholarly journal *American Art*.

This weeks Rotarian of the Week recipient was Mary Stenseth.

Mary's greatest passion for service developed during the first year of Rotary membership. That year found her traveling for the first time to Asia to the International Conference in Singapore. She participated in the pre conference Youth Exchange program meeting Thai leaders of youth exchange. After keeping in touch for two years, she was invited to visit and volunteer teach in Thai schools. Mary spends anywhere from 2 to 6 months annually volunteer teaching in the poorer government high schools which have no money to hire Australian or other western native English teachers.

Rotary for Mary has given her purpose in life and the opportunity to be of use to a people she never thought she would know. Being embedded in Thai life through home stays with Thai Rotary sponsors, has given Mary a greater understanding of who we are as Americans, how we think, and how we act the way we do. "My commitment to Rotary can be a dual commitment to the world or the local community. In the end, Rotary has given me a stable, on-going way to help build a future for young people anywhere."
