Ryan Hubris "The Vietnamese Community"

Ryan Nguyen Hubris was 8 years old when his family fled Saigon by boat in 1977. They spent four days on the open ocean before being rescued by a merchant ship and arrived in San Jose with virtually nothing.

By the sixth grade—just three years after having come to this country - **Ryan** was representing his school in a regional speech competition titled, "What Education Means to Me." Hubris attended Santa Clara University where he graduated with a B.S. in finance and Spanish. He earned his Master's degree in

public administration from the University of Southern California.

Ryan worked in public service, the nonprofit sector and education before going on to a very successful career in business and real estate development. He was President and COO of Bridgecreek Development Company, a full-service real estate development, management and consulting firm.

Ryan serves as the Executive Director of the Vietnamese American National Gala (VANG) and is currently the Executive Director of the Viet Heritage Society (VHS), which is building the Viet Heritage Gardens in San Jose. He became involved with the Viet Heritage Gardens in 1991, as Community Liaison for the late San Jose City Councilman George Shirakawa, Sr.
