



# Rotary Personals "Vic LoBue and Mike Conniff

His grandparents, traveling by boat from Italy to America in the latter part of the 19th century and settling in San Jose, make **Vic LoBue** a third generation native. He was born into an agricultural and business family background and attended local schools, being influenced by the Notre Dame Sisters and the Jesuits of both Bellarmine and Santa Clara University. He participated in and managed a family owned business, called Caldo Oil Company, originating in 1934, distributing gasoline, diesel, and all petroleum products, until his recent retirement. A member of the San Jose Rotary Club for 29 years and active in various organizations, boards, his Alma Mater, and Saint Mary's Church where he was married to



Marijoe over 48 years ago. Vic will describe the transition from Italian immigrants and the change within the Santa Clara Valley, as well as some of his personal background.



**Michael L. Conniff** directs the Global Studies Initiative at San Jose State University, helping to prepare students to succeed as citizens and professionals in the world at large. The program also fosters faculty and staff development and exchanges with universities overseas.

Conniff earned degrees at UC-Berkeley and Stanford and has published a number of books on modern history, most recently *A History of Modern Latin America* (2005, with Lawrence Clayton), *Africans in the Americas* (2003, with T. J. Davis), and *Panama and the United States* (2001). He has lived overseas for a dozen years, has held several post-doc appointments (including three

Fulbright tours), and served in the U.S. Peace Corps. He lectures often in Portuguese and Spanish. Before joining SJSU, he taught history at the University of New Mexico and helped create Latin American studies programs at Auburn University and the University of South Florida. He has won and managed grants worth more than two million dollars.


